Da Nang: A Solution for Svalable Urban Street Flood Sensing

Urban flooding is difficult to predict, and most cities lack the tools to track its evolution automatically. They suggest a highly scalable intelligent system can simultaneously produce high-resolution data for future use and send out high-abstract warning signals, achieved a classification accuracy of 89.58% and flood image segmentation accuracy of 95.33%.
